## Evansville Retired Teachers Association Executive Board Meeting May 4, 2017

<u>Call to Order</u>: President Tom Wiggers called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. at American Baptist East Church and welcomed everyone. In addition to the president, the following were in attendance: Brenda Beeler, Terry Becker, Judy Isaac, Walt Lewis, Diana Luck, Diane Meier, Don Mosbey, Fred Naab, Darla Olberding, David Pfettscher, Donna Schmidt, Sandra Schmidt, Brenda Weber, and Lino Wiseman.

Meditation: Tom requested a moment of silence in memory of Bob McIntosh and Mary Tremper.

<u>Acceptance of Agenda</u>: Tom asked that the agenda be accepted with flexibility. Diane Meier made a motion to accept the agenda with flexibility. Don Mosbey seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Approval of March 2, 2017, Executive Board Minutes: The minutes were accepted as printed.

#### Officer Reports:

<u>Treasurer</u>: Lino Wiseman distributed the financial report for March 31, 2017. He explained that \$70 for the seven ERTA members who passed away this year has been deposited into the Hensley account, and a dollar for each of the 274 paying members has also been deposited into that account. The 2016/2017 Budget was listed on the financial report as well as the 2017/2018 Proposed Budget Items were color-coded to show which amounts in the current budget would remain the same in the proposed budget and which would increase or decrease. Lino made a motion that the 2117/2018 Proposed Budget be accepted. Judy Isaac seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>President-Elect</u>: Terry Becker reported on next week's picnic. Wolf's Bar-B-Q is the caterer. He also announced that the board meetings are set up for next year.

## Committee Reports:

Audit/Budget: Darla Olberding reported that an audit would take place in July.

<u>Fellowship/Necrology</u>: Due to the passing of Mary Tremper, Judy Isaac is now sending get well cards to members who are ill and sympathy cards to families of members who have passed.

Membership: Tom discussed ways to increase membership.

<u>Publications</u>: Diana Luck verified with the board that the membership form would only be printed in the newsletter in August and October. Board members will only be listed in August.

<u>Reservations</u>: Diana Luck reported 131 reservations at this time.

<u>Publicity</u>: Judy Isaac said that she sent a notice to the newspaper about our meeting.

Tom added that he had sent a copy of our newsletter to IRTA.

<u>Special Projects</u>: Brenda Weber noted that any money left over from this year's luncheon at AIS will be given to the teachers at AIS for next year.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Diane Meier spoke about the issue that board members discussed at the March board meeting concerning several of the Hensley applications. 


## ERTA TRIVIA NO. 8
