October Luncheon 2021





Thank You Note: Janet said that she received a note of thanks from IRTA Executive Director Laura Penman who attended our August Luncheon.

Approval of Minutes for August 5, 2021: The minutes were approved as printed.

Officer Reports:

<u>Treasurer</u>: The financial report prepared by Lynn Arteberry and distributed by the president listed the following information:

<u>President-elect</u>: Jan Craig announced that 81 had signed up for the luncheon so far. There will be a dessert table with a choice of pie or cake to go with the box lunches. The speaker will be Dona Bone of the Evansville Wartime Museum. We will move to the Sanctuary for a PowerPoint presentation. Jan noted that private tours of the museum can be arranged. There is a minimum of 15 required at the cost of \$11 per person.

Committee Reports:

Community Service: Jane Staton asked that we keep track of our volunteer hours.

<u>Fellowship/Necrology</u>: Donna Lutz said that Judy Isaac needs one more member to help check in those attending the luncheon.

Membership: Janet spoke for Darlene Brockriede. There are 244 paid or free members. Memberships will be accepted at the meeting.

Publications: Diana Luck thanked those who submitted pictures from Frog Follies.

<u>Reservations</u>: Janet pointed out that the luncheon held in October is usually our smallest gathering; however, reservations are going well.

Special Projects: Janet announced that ERTA was awarded \$1,555.31 from Frog Follies, and \$304.42 of that amount was used to feed our volunteers.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Diane Meier informed the Board that two of last year's recipients of the Hensley were no longer with EVSC; therefore, \$755 is available and can be given to other recipients who need additional funds. She said that the remaining \$16,000 will be awarded in 2022. If all of that amount is not used, Diane wondered if the remaining amount could be given to Teacher Locker.

Darla Olberding made a motion to give any remaining money to Teacher Locker. Doris Beard seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

<u>IRTA/Liaison</u>: Diane Meier reported that the Indiana Legislature met on August 17, 2021, but members did not meet in person. The 13th Check wasn't heard in the Senate, but work will continue. Diane said that the money is there for the 13th Check and a COLA.

Information Items:

<u>Candy Basket Delivery</u>: Janet announced that baskets full of candy were delivered by teams of retired teachers on Friday, August 6, 2021, to all schools in the EVSC. The baskets were happily received.

<u>Hall of Fame Celebration</u>: Brenda Beeler reported on attending the EVSC Class of 2020 Hall of Fame Celebration. Lana Burton, Carol Koehler, and Walt Lewis were honored for Outstanding Achievement in the Field of Education. Archie and Louise Owen and also Mike Owen were honored. Amy Walker and Lilly King were also honorees. Janet and Jan were in attendance as well.

<u>Frog Follies</u>: Janet noted that a replacement for Jim Sharp will be needed next year. It's possible that two or three members will be needed. She added that Frog Follies benefits ERTA.

Old Business:

<u>Communication with New Retirees</u>: Janet has communicated with new retirees. Jane Staton has called 2020 and 2021 new retirees.

Volunteers: Volunteers are needed at Teacher Locker and Hangars. Hangars needs items delivered occasionally.

New Business:

<u>December Luncheon</u>: Janet announced that Dr. David Smith will be our guest, and we are working to get a school music group. We need to decide on whether to have a buffet or box lunches. The board will make the decision at a later time.
