Evansville Retired Teachers Association Executive Board Meeting March 3, 2022

<u>Call to Order</u>: President Janet Leistner called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. at Embrace Church and welcomed everyone. In addition to the president, the following were in attendance: Doris Beard, Brenda Beeler, Darlene Brockriede, Fred Bullinger, Jan Craig, Steve Fritz, Judy Isaac, Diana Luck, Donna Lutz, Diane Meier, Don Mosbey, Darla Olberding, David Pfettscher, Donna Schmidt, Sandra Schmidt, and Jane Staton.

Approval of Minutes from December 2, 2021: The minutes were accepted as printed.

Officer Reports:

<u>Treasurer</u>: Lynn Arteberry distributed the following financial report showing each account balance as of March 1, 2022:

Checking: \$3,248.62 Savings: \$240.83 Scholarship: \$16,122.24 Total Assets: \$19,611.69

Lynn also reported that \$423 was sent to the Tri-State Food Bank. (Note: Money donated by members who attended the luncheon in December)

<u>President</u>: Janet announced that three EVSC students, who are leaders in our community, will speak at next week's luncheon.

Committee Reports:

<u>Community Service</u>: Jane Staton said that volunteer hours were sent to IRTA. The president added that 5,100 were submitted.

<u>Fellowship/Necrology</u>: Donna Lutz reported sending a sympathy card to Tom Anderson due to the passing of his wife Sandy in January. A get-well card was sent to Sharon Overton.

<u>Membership</u>: Janet noted that membership currently numbers 303, and we are working to get additional members. Janet complimented Darlene Brockriede on the job she has done chairing this committee and announced that Darlene has decided to step down as chair. Allyson Green has been selected to fill this position.

<u>Program/Luncheon/Reservations</u>: Jan Craig announced that there are 91 reservations at this time. The program will be a panel discussion where each member tells what preparation he or she had to take over a leadership role. The panel will consist of Aimee Buckingham Stachura, the CEO of Girl Scouts of SW Indiana; Kendall Paul, the CEO of Vanderburgh Humane Society; and Andrew Backes, the CEO of Big Brothers and Big Sisters of SW Indiana. All three attended schools in the EVSC.

Doris Beard made a motion to award each speaker a \$25 gift card. Steve Fritz seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Jan asked the board how the meal should be served. The decision was that there should be servers. Jan then went over the menu.

<u>Publications</u>: Diana Luck thanked those who had sent pictures for the newsletters.

<u>Scholarship</u>: Diane Meier reported on the Hensley Scholarships that were awarded at the beginning of the pandemic. At this time, two teachers at McCutchanville School have been able to attend a conference. They will be sharing what they learned with other educators. Diane went on to say that some of the conferences have been cancelled, and some were virtual instead of in-person.

Diane would like to carry this project out to January of 2023 and add \$400 to the account for increased costs such as travel. Judy Isaac made a motion to add \$400 to the scholarship account. Donna Lutz seconded. After some discussion, the motion passed.

<u>IRTA Liaison/Legislature</u>: Diane said that the Indiana Legislature did put money into the retirement fund and investigated the COLA and Thirteenth Check.

Message from Diane Meier, IRTA Liaison/Legislative

The IRTA Legislative Committee met on August 17, 2022, in Indianapolis. It was noted by members of the committee and by the legislators that members did not contact legislators during the session but after the session when many were displeased with the one percent COLA rather than the 13th check. What we will have to do in the future is make the case for the "13TH check" early, before the legislative session begins.

Once we know who our legislators will be for 2023, we are encouraging members throughout the state to express thanks for the things that the legislature did for retired educators:

- a.) 1% COLA
- b.) Nearly 1 billion dollars into the Pension Stabilization Fund
- c.) \$600 to buy down the debt of the pre '96 fund Doing this has helped protect our pension funds!

When the office sends out a request for emails to legislators, members need to respond, before and during the session.

The committee will meet again in August to discuss further strategies for the 2023 session.
