Executive Board Meeting Minutes

May 2, 2013



President Gene VanStone called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. at the Phipps Center. The following Board members were in attendance: Darlene Brockriede, Pat Eager, Linda Hape, Diana Luck, Diane Meier, Fred Naab, Jerry Noland, Nancy Noland, Darla Olberding, Charlotte Reitz, Ed Rusk, Sandra Schmidt, Linda Staley, Gene VanStone, and Lino Wiseman.

Before Chaplain Ed Rusk read a meditation, he read a statement from the chairman of the American Baptist East trustees that said there is a policy of no smoking on the church property.

For the meditation, Ed read about being able to determine the caliber of a person by the amount of opposition it takes to deter him. Then, he read Proverbs 24:10 and prayed.

The March 7, 2013, Executive Board Minutes were approved as printed.

Officer Reports:

<u>Treasurer</u>: Lino Wiseman distributed the financial report before the meeting. During the meeting he explained that some amounts were highlighted in green because ERTA received more than expected or spent less; other areas were highlighted in peach because we received less than expected or spent more. Lino also reported on the ERTA University of Evansville and the University of Southern Indiana Endowments. The following amounts were split equally between the two universities:

\$20 (Two members passed away this year.)

\$302 (Three hundred and two members paid dues this year.)

<u>President</u>: Gene said that serving as ERTA President has been a positive experience. Recently, he represented ERTA at the Scholarship Recognition Day at the University of Evansville and attended the Indiana House and Senate Resolution Day where IRTA President Bob Kraft was honored for his service. President-Elect Bob Suhrheinrich attended Scholarship Recognition Day at the University of Southern Indiana.

Committee Reports:

Auditing and Budget: Darla Olberding announced the books would be audited in July.

Publications: Jerry Noland said that the web site needs updating.

Reservations: Diana Luck reported 136 reservations for the May 9th luncheon.

Scholarship: Diane Meier spoke about the Hensley Scholarship saying that a teacher must have taught five years to be eligible to apply. If a group is applying for a scholarship, each teacher must be listed as well as the number of years taught.

<u>IRTA Liaison/ Legislative Chair</u>: Diane reported IRTA is discussing the possibility of introducing a hybrid bill that would ask for a COLA and a stipend.

<u>Necrology</u>: Linda Hape reported the passing of Francheon Gordan Sabel. Ed Rusk will read the Necrology Report at the luncheon.

<u>Public Relations</u>: Nancy Noland announced that the IRTA Public Relations Committee awarded our newsletter Honorable Mention.

Special Projects: Darla reported on the Christmas project, which was sponsoring a reception for the high school art teachers. It was held on Saturday, April 6, 2013, at the museum. After expenses were paid, the remaining project money collected at the December meeting was donated to the museum. Darla suggested that we fund the following projects with the money in our Special Projects fund:

- 1. Provide a basket of candy to each EVSC school in August to welcome teachers back for the new school year.
- 2. Sponsor an artisan for \$450 at Historic New Harmony's Heritage Days. This is a three-day event with over 3,000 students and teachers attending.
- 3. Support the Evansville Philharmonic's Helen McKinney Youth Concerts with a \$500 contribution. This is a three-day event with six performances for third, fourth, and fifth grade students. Over 7,000 students and teachers attend.

Diane Meier made a motion to approve the three projects, and Pat Eager seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Old Business: There was none.

<u>New Business</u>: There was some discussion about e-mailing the newsletter to members with Internet at some point in time. Those without Internet would continue to receive the newsletter by mail.

Diane Meier suggested that Nancy Tolson and Bob Kraft handle the installation of officers at the luncheon meeting.

The Indiana Retired Teachers Association Representative Assembly will be held on June 19, 2013, in Indianapolis. Delegates are needed.

<u>Announcement</u>: The next Executive Board Meeting will be on August 1, 2013, with President Bob Suhrheinrich presiding.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m.

May 9, 2013

All excess reserves over fifty million will be put into the Pension Stabilization Fund this year. Also, Bill 1080 will provide the 13th check in September.

Nancy Tolson returned telling about a resolution sponsored by Vaneta Becker in the Senate and a resolution sponsored by Suzanne Crouch in the House honoring Bob.




GOING GREEN

This coming September your money will be there, but it isn't guaranteed every year! It only comes about through the lobbying efforts of the Indiana Retired Teachers Association with your state legislators.

Based on your years of teaching, you will receive the following amount:

- 30 or more years, \$450.00
- 20 to 29 years, \$375.00
- 10 to 19 years, \$275.00
- 5 to 9 years, \$150.00

Now is the time for all of us to support and join the Indiana Retired Teachers Association. It is only \$35.00 per year. And as you can see from the figures above, you receive much more in return than the \$35.00 paid out in annual dues.

The Indiana Retired Teachers Association Representative Assembly was held this past June 19 in Indianapolis. If you have never participated in this event, please consider doing so next year. It is truly the representative process in action.

There are currently eight areas of the state represented, and in 2014, realignment of the 92 counties will take place expanding to ten areas. Vanderburgh County will move from Area 7 to Area 9. The purpose of the change is for better representation throughout the state.
