Message from Legislative Liaison Diane Meier

We are in the middle of the second month of the Legislative session. The thirteenth check has passed the House committee unanimously and is headed toward the Senate. If the bill passes both houses, it will ensure the 13th check for two years. Although we are grateful for this check, a COLA is not even being discussed this year. The last COLA teachers received was in 2007, and honestly, unless the majority in the State House changes, I don't believe we will ever receive a COLA. While the 13th check is appreciated, it will not help 5, 10, 15 years from now. The emphasis now is trying to increase the 13th check; however, until revenue projections are known, the beginning of April, it is difficult to know whether that will be a possibility. The Legislative Brunch is April 9, from 9:30 to 11:30, at the State House. Since the brunch is early in April, we need to have teachers who are willing to go talk with Legislators about increasing the 13th check. December 6, 2018

<u>Call to Order</u>: President Walt Lewis called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. at American Baptist East Church and welcomed everyone. In addition to the president, the following were in attendance: Doris Beard, Terry Becker, Darlene Brockriede, Fred Bullinger, Steve Fritz, Judy Isaac, Janet Leistner, Donna Lutz, Diane Meier, Don Mosbey, Fred Naab, David Pfettscher, Donna Schmidt, Sandra Schmidt, and Lino Wiseman.

<u>Acceptance of Agenda</u>: Lino Wiseman made a motion to accept the agenda with flexibility. Diane Meier seconded. The motion passed.

<u>Approval of October 4, 2018, Executive Board Minutes</u>: Since there were no corrections or additions to the minutes, they were accepted as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Lino Wiseman distributed a financial report as of October 31, 2018.

The report will be filed for audit. He also distributed a report on the funds remaining for Hensley Scholarships. Ten thousand can be awarded to active teachers for this year's Hensley Scholarships and ten thousand for next year's scholarships as well. The remaining funds, which currently total \$6,308.00, could go for student scholarships at UE and USI.

A thank you note from UE student Brooke Bittner was read. She is a future educator who received a \$2,002.00 scholarship from ERTA at UE.

Committee Reports:

<u>Membership</u>: Darlene Brockriede announced that there are currently 271 members. There were 360 at this time last year. Those who made lunch reservations but haven't paid this year's dues will be reminded when checking in at the luncheon.

<u>Nominations</u>: President-Elect Steve Fritz will speak with the Nominating Committee, which consists of Directors Fred Bullinger, Don Mosbey, and Fred Naab, and consult with Director Janet Leistner to determine who will replace her next year. Janet is slated to become president-elect in May of 2019.

<u>Program</u>: The Thompkins Middle School Choir will present the program at next week's luncheon.

<u>Publicity</u>: Doris Beard reported that the ERTA Facebook page has been ready since the October meeting. The name of the page is ERTA.

Reservations: Walt announced 135 reservations for next week's luncheon.

<u>Christmas Project</u>: Free-will donations for a non-profit will be accepted at the luncheon. Walt has chosen the Public Education Foundation to be the recipient.

Information Items:

- 1. Board members donated funds to help pay for the poinsettias that will decorate the luncheon tables next week.
- 2. The slate of officers for next year is as follows: President, Steven Fritz; President-Elect, Janet Leistner; Treasurer, Lino Wiseman; and Directors, Diane Meier and David Pfettscher. A director, who is yet to be determined, will serve a one-year term to fill the position vacated by Janet Leistner. Directors Fred Bullinger, Don Mosbey, and Fred Naab have another year to serve as well as Secretary Sandra Schmidt.
- 3. The next meeting of the ERTA Executive Board is on Thursday, March 7, 2019.
